- Development of minimum and best practice standards in collision investigation, criminal prosecution, civil compensation and victims' rights.
- Inclusion of collision investigation, criminal prosecution, civil compensation and victims' rights in road safety programmes in the second half of the Decade of Action.
- Closer collaboration between road safety and justice professionals and survivor advocates.

**Format:** Presentations and case studies followed by moderated discussion
